Continue to work on addition and subtraction using a 100 square or on an empty number line.

Consolidate multiplication and division facts (2x, 5x, 10x tables).

Handling Data: Collecting data using tally charts and tables. Present results in a pictogram, block graph or a carroll diagram.

Measure time on an analogue and digital clock.

Science

Identify the different food groups and learn about which foods belong to these groups.

Learn about different foods eaten and prepared for special occasions. Plan a wedding meal for Cinderella and the Prince.

Plan a healthy basket of food for Grandma (in the story Little Red Riding Hood) to help her to get better.
