



How does your garden grow?



Research the artwork created by Italian artist Arcimboldo.



Write a fact file about his life. Then create a piece of art inspired by him using real fruit and vegetables, or cut out pictures from magazines.

Take a picture of your creation.

Have a go at making a homemade pizza. With an adult, talk about where each ingredient comes from. Now show $\frac{1}{2}$ and then $\frac{1}{4}$. Can you find $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of any other everyday objects?



Take a picture of your efforts.

Using either non-fiction books or the internet research some modern farming equipment. What is it used for? Write a few sentences about its use, draw and label the object.



Extra challenge:

How is this the same or different to what was used years ago?

With an adult go on a walk in the countryside. Can you spot any farming taking place? What different types of farming can you see? Take some pictures of the journey of your walk, and write a few descriptive sentences about where you went and what you saw, to share with the rest of the class.

Remember to continue to read at least four times a week and record your reading in your reading record.



Create a repeating pattern using fruit and vegetable printing. Imagine each fruit/vegetable represented a different number (2,5,10), can you show number patterns in a sequence of prints?



Practise halving and doubling numbers to recall fluently. Ladybirds may help you, perhaps you could make your own? Cover over one wing to show half of a number, can you remember halves and doubles without looking?



Plants need water, air and sunlight to grow. Can seeds grow without soil? Grow your own cress head to find out!



Do you know what happens to your food from the farm to your fork? Or if the food you eat comes from a plant or an animal?
