Science

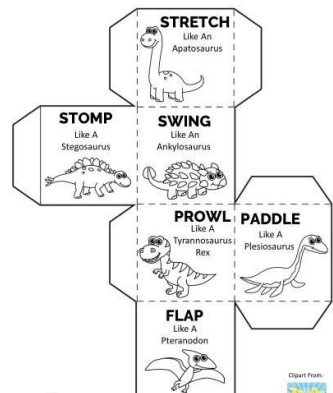
Look at the attached theories as to why the dinosaurs became extinct and watch the following video;

How did the Dinosaurs Become Extinct?

Once scientists had established that dinosaurs and more than 50% of other life forms on the planet disappeared in a mass extinction about 66 million years ago they began to try and understand why.

These are some of the more far-fetched theories for the cause of the mass extinction:



- 1 The dinosaurs had been around for a long time so they were tired and became extinct.
- 2 There were huge dinosaur 'wars' resulting in massive numbers of dinosaur deaths.
- 3 They were destroyed by visiting aliens.
- 4 The Alvarez Theory suggests that an asteroid approximately 6 miles long slammed into the Earth and caused a series of reactions which ended in the death of the dinosaurs.
