


Year 2 - Home Learning Summer Term 2 Week 4 (22.6.20 - 26.6.20)

<h4>Wednesday - Index</h4> <p>Where would you find an Index? What is an Index used for? Look at some non-fiction books to remind you what an index is, how it is organised and what it is used for. What do you notice about how an Index is organised? Organise these words into alphabetical order:</p> <p>moat, battlements, arrow slits, drawbridge, portcullis, bailey, keep, ramparts, catapult, battering ram, dungeon, kitchen, tower, gatehouse</p> <p>Remember if you have more than one word beginning with the same letter then you look at the next letter in the words to see which of those comes first in the alphabet. E.g. ball comes before bell because a comes before e in the alphabet.</p>	<h4>Thursday - Glossary</h4> <p>Where would you find a Glossary? How is a Glossary similar/different to an index? What is a Glossary used for?</p> <p>Use the words from your castles index yesterday and now create a glossary by adding definitions for them.</p>	<h4>Friday - Captions</h4> <p>Captions are short sentences written beside or underneath a picture or photograph that explains a bit more about it.</p> <p>Choose at least three of the pictures of castles and write a caption for each one.</p>
