





All week, the children were buzzing with excitement.

Why are the children 'buzzing with excitement'?






"I hope Charlie lets me ride in the fire engine!" said Billy.


"I really hope he shows us how to use the hose!" said Amari.







"Is it hard?" asked Annie.





They headed out behind the fire station to find a big, bright red fire engine.




"If you'd like to get in then I need to see some great teamwork," said Charlie. "Are you ready to take turns?"




A sea of hands shot up and Charlie chose Amari first.



"It's very powerful," said Charlie. "Hold on tight and we'll do it together. Let's see if the water will reach that building."








