Our September Start

Welcome back to school everyone. We have had a very busy September at the start of the new school year. We have welcomed 60 new children into Reception. We have also welcomed back 120 pupils across Year 1 and Year 2.

It was lovely to be able to invite parents in for the Meet the Teacher sessions. As not everyone was able to attend, we will make sure the information from these sessions is shared on Tapestry and the school website.

We are continuing to have a focus on reading over the next year. Mrs Burt has sent out an updated RED TED letter explaining our expectations around reading at home. We will continue to reward this within school.

Another focus for teaching and learning this year is "Mastery of Number". We are taking part in a national project around this with the National Centre for Excellence in Mathematics. Teachers will be attending training and providing the children with an additional short daily Maths Meeting. Parents can support the children with KIRFS (Key Instant Recall Facts) which Miss Brice will send more information out about next week.

Parent Consultations will take place after half term and will be via the Schoolcloud system. More details will be sent out closer to half term and you will be able to book appointments through the online system. We will also ensure there is the opportunity to come into the classroom with your child to look at their books after half term.

COVID continues to be affecting school life to a certain extent and we have kept many of our measures in place to reduce transmission. At the moment, we do not have any pupils absent with COVID but it is still very much in the community. Continuing to be vigilant and having a PCR if there are any symptoms seems to be the best way forward. Absence has also been relatively high with non-COVID illnesses. Please remember to ring the school if your child is unwell and they will be absent.


