## Attendance update

Attendance remains a focus for improvement. The school now has to report weekly attendance to the Department for Education. There are termly meetings with the Attendance Officer who analyses the data and questions individual pupils where the attendance drops below 90%. The Local Authority have expressed concern about the number of holidays being taken in term time. We have now had 27 holiday requests that have or will qualify for a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Year 1 children and some of Year 2 will be taking the Phonics Screening in June. This could be administered at any point during the week beginning 12th June and therefore it is imperative that they are in school every day that week.

### PARKING

We have had more complaints from neighbours about the parking situation outside school. Please ensure that you do not block driveways and park with due consideration to residents, other vehicles and, importantly, pedestrians.

We will be monitoring the situation after half term and will speak to anyone who appears to be causing an obstruction.

## **MILK**

Residents of the Woottons may be aware that there is no longer a milk delivery service in the area. We have also been affected at school and can no longer get the small cartons of milk for the children. We are researching alternatives for the new school year but will not be able to provide milk for the final half term of this year. Children are given the option of milk at lunchtime if they have a school meal.
