6	Chairs Report Mrs Cook has not yet had a meeting with Governor Services to report on.		
7	 Headteacher's Report Mrs Cook asked about the persistent problem of absence and if paperwork is submitted in all cases for parents to pay a fixed penalty notice. The Headteacher said yes, a member of staff in the office has now been employed for an additional hour a week to process these. Mrs Cook asked if there is anything else the School can do to encourage higher attendance. The Headteacher said that she is looking to re-introduce the 100% attendance award (but allowing for some sick days). Governors are happy that the school is doing all it can to make parents aware of the attendance policy, and reenforce the importance of high attendance. But it is felt that the financial penalty set nationally is no deterrent 		

	to families when factoring the cost of holidays in term time.	[]

	collated instead of TA's counting up from the books each week.
