	The new model Terms of Reference for a governing board without committees was agreed to be adopted and		
	signed by Mrs Cook. Each Governor then signed the document to accept their designated role.		
7	Headteacher's Report		
	The following items were discussed from the report and questions in blue were answered by the Headteacher;		
	Mrs Cook asked:		
	In terms of attendance - how do other schools implement penalties? There is the same fixed penalty notice		
	procedure for all schools.		
	The family that are going away, have they taken on board the concerns of their children missing 5 weeks of school.		
	The attendance team at NCC have suggested a weekly zoom call with the family, for safeguarding rather than		
	educational reasons.		
	Has there been any improvement with the Yr 2 child at the SRB or is it too early to say? It is too early to say, but		
	they have settled in well.		
	Considering the staffing difficulties due to absence this half term how is staff morale? Considering the time of year		
	and workload morale remains good.		
	Regarding the caretaker position, you have stated that Andy would be happy to leave earlier than July if someone		
	was appointed. Are you looking to advertise soon? Look to advertise early next year, hoping to use social media		
	to try and attract more applicants.		
	How is pupil premium funding used? It is used for English and maths intervention with pupil premium children		

being in mixed groups with others so more are benefitting.

Cllr Nockolds asked:

Given the school has 22 SEN pupils, is the school able to give the support that is expected? There is a high number of speech and language children, but TA support is able to meet their needs.

Everyone who attended the Christmas reading café agreed that it was a successful evening and nice to be able to hold it again after the restrictions of Covid.

Safeguarding Report -

The following items were discussed from the report and questions in blue were answered by the Headteacher; Mrs Cook asked:

Are there any concerns or worries about how safeguarding duties are fulfilled? The headteacher and Mrs Burt are up to date on their training.

We need to discuss and identify if any training needs are relevant for the Governing body in relation to Safeguarding? All Governors have completed training except Mrs Lali. The Headteacher, Mrs Burt and Mrs Cook need to complete safer recruitment training.

PE and Sports Premium

There has been an inconsistency of availability of the swimming pool at Grefriars, meaning planned lessons have not been able to take place.

The OPAL scheme needs re-invigoration; this will take place in the springtime.

8 Half Termly Focus

The Budget reports were discussed and questions in blue were answered by the Headteacher;

- Budget Control Report was reviewed including transactions to the end of October.
 - · There is more income than expected due to a child with an EHCP.
 - Mrs Cook asked what was included in the income from sales? This is milk which parents pay for, and income from services provided is breakfast club.
- Budget Plan Revision 2
 - · There is more support grant than expected and SEN funding is higher.
 - · The PTFA are paying towards the daily mile track and for new classroom books.
 - · More Covid catch up funding is expected.
 - There is an increase in staffing costs with pay rises for teachers and support staff.
 - Mr Ring asked about the 24/25 pupil forecast which is based on the low Reception intake at present. The Headteacher said there has been good feedback from parent visits for intake in 2023.
 - Mrs Cook asked about the reduced budget for re-decoration. This is due to the caretaker undertaking much of the work, therefore the only expenditure has been on materials.
